

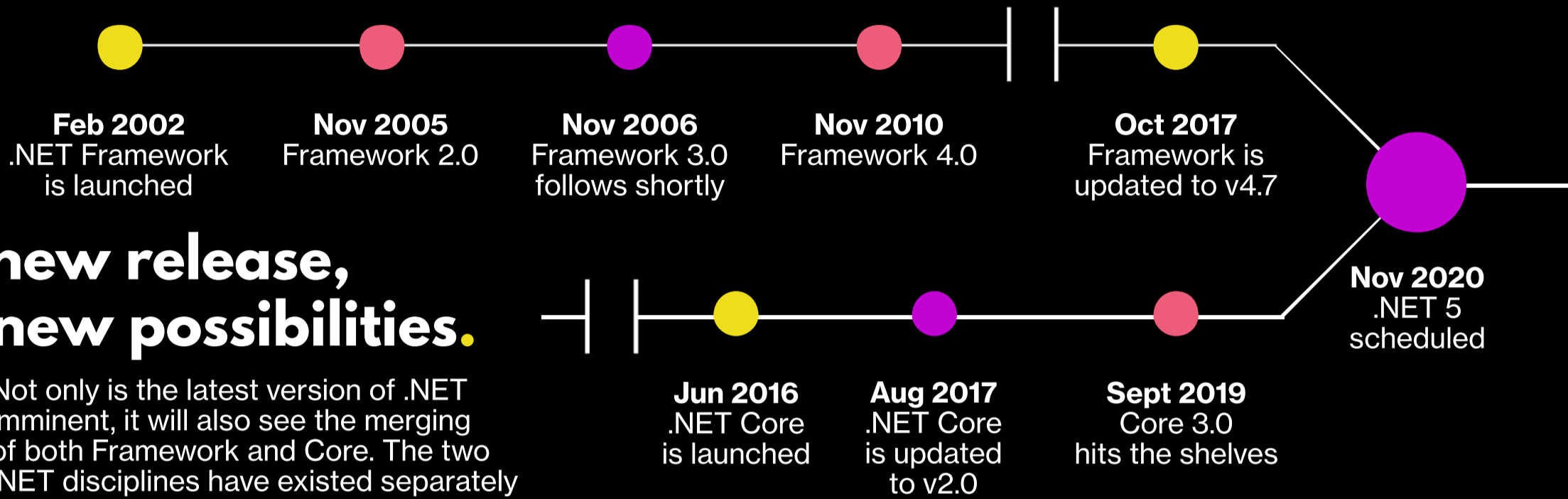

but first, a brief history...

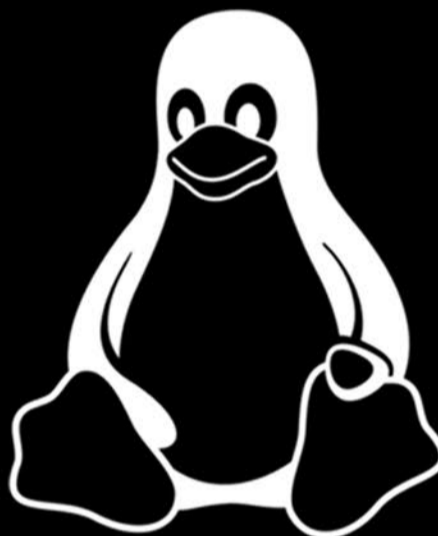
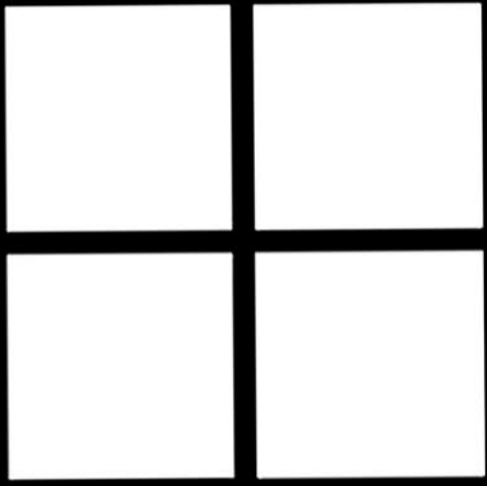


## 1. new release, new possibilities.

Not only is the latest version of .NET imminent, it will also see the merging of both Framework and Core. The two .NET disciplines have existed separately since Core's launch in 2016. November's new product, .NET 5, brings them together.

## 2. no limitations.

The Microsoft .NET Framework supports as many as 40 different programming languages. From C# and IronPython, to non-Microsoft options like Ada, Lexico and Oberon. It even supports Phrogram, a child-friendly coding language.



## 3. cross-platform support.

When .NET 5 Preview 7 was released in July, Microsoft revealed that it would now come with support for whatever platform you may be programming on. Even as a Microsoft product, you'll now be able to operate within .NET applications on Mac OS and Linux devices too.

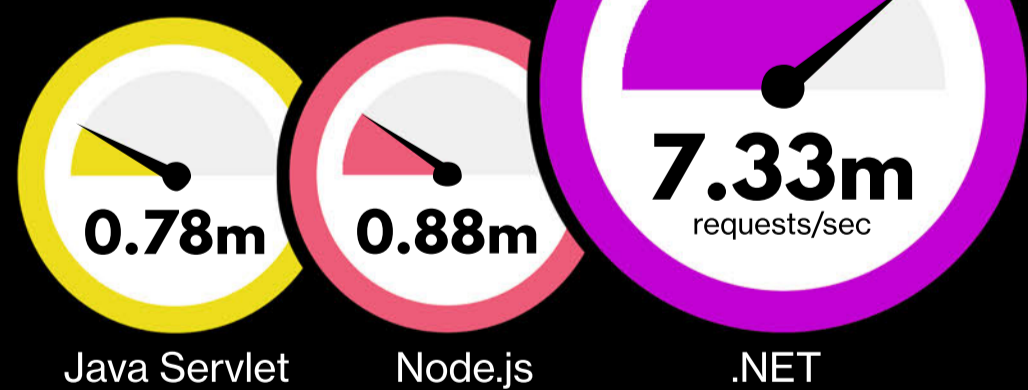
